Amenity Building Cabins and steadily

Come rain or shine, the teams working on the cabins and on the amenity building have been making the most of the longer days. Over the last few weeks, the Amenity Building has been insulated and had its roof installed. Next, it will be clad in the beautiful larch that we have milled ourselves, and then the internal fit out can commence.

Up on the hill meanwhile, the chimneys have now been fitted in most of the Cabins by the Northwoods Construction Team. The log burners in each cabin will Tractor returns from major refurbishment provide not only heat but offer cooking facilities for very simple meals, and for more involved cooking the amenity building will contain a fully equipped kitchen.

And with the return of our tractor (more on that further down) we have begun tidying up the landscape around the cabin site. We've been clearing fallen trees, tidying up brush wood and marking out where paths might go.

Gathering this type of information enhances the understanding of our community and can help government, funders and community groups to meet community needs, prioritise projects and even with the allocation of funding.
